



CASINO REOPENING: CONTINUING TO PROVIDE A SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR **EMPLOYEES AND PATRONS**

On behalf of the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise Board of Directors and management team, we are pleased to provide an update to the Navajo People after being closed for over one year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This update provides highlights of our reopening and workplace safety and enhanced health and safety measures implemented prior to and after reopening.

Background

In 2006 the Navajo Nation established and invested in the development of the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise (NNGE).

This was a very good Navajo Nation investment. Although NNGE is a young Enterprise, we built four casinos, a premier hotel and a travel plaza, invested in new land for future economic development, provide good jobs to nearly 1,000 Navajo people representing 105 of the 110 chapters.

Within the first ten (10) years of operations, the NNGE created 1,175 direct jobs, 1,581 indirect jobs and 5,360 construction jobs for a total of 8,116 jobs (Source: Independent Economic Impact Study, The Dupris Consulting Group, which performs economic impact analysis for the National Indian Gaming Association).

In just the last six years the NNGE has returned more than \$200 million to the Navajo Nation through payments to the Master Trust Fund, Navajo Tribal Utility Authority, Rehabilitation Trust Fund, and Gaming Distribution Fund. NNGE is one of the Navajo Nation's largest employers, and indirectly provides for the employment of its regulators at the Navajo Nation Gaming Regulatory Office.

The system is designed with an underfloor air distribution system introducing fresh air at the floor with the return at the ceiling directing any smoke within the building in an upward direction away from visitors and employees.




Illustration of NNGE's latest technology air ventilation system. This system significantly improves overall indoor environment for casino visitors and employees.

Reopening, Recovery, Health and Safety

The top priority of enterprise leadership is the safety of NNGE employees and visitors. On March 17, 2020. to help mitigate the spread of COVID-19, NNGE closed all of its gaming facilities—Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort, Fire Rock Navajo Casino, Northern Edge Navajo Casino, and Flowing Water Navajo Casino. Our gaming facilities reopened one year later in coordination with the Navajo Nation Health Command Operations Center (NNHCOC) and in compliance with all applicable Navajo Nation Public Health Orders.

To reopen safely and responsibly, NNGE developed a Reopening and Workplace Safety Plan with best-inclass protocols that prioritize safety above all else. The Plan aligns with guidelines from Navajo Department of Health, Centers for Disease Control & Prevention, National Indian Gaming Commission, Occupational Safety and Health Administration, and state and gaming agency directives for casino reopening. The NNGE also consulted with public health experts in infection prevention and infectious disease management to continuously refine and confirm the quality of it's Plan.

The health and safety of our employees and visitors has been a priority from the very beginning. For this reason, the NNGE installed an HVAC designed with an underfloor air distribution system that introduces fresh air and directs any smoke within the building in an upward direction away from visitors and employees.

Additionally, routine air quality tests are conducted by Western Technologies, an independent engineering firm. The results consistently show that the air quality is well below OSHA standards for harmful particulates including nicotine, bacteria and other volatile organic compounds.

The health and safety of our employees and visitors has been a priority from the very beginning.
